

Phase 2 of the Town Water Risk Reduction Program



Building on the work over the past two years of the Town Water Risk Reduction Program, phase 2 has now commenced. We've created four teams to deliver phase 2 of the Town Water Risk Reduction Program over the next four years, focusing on:

- program management
- skills and training
- advanced operational support
- emergency, incident response and WHS.

We are currently establishing the program governance, recruiting roles and further defining the high-level scope to achieve our goals. We're making good progress on these steps and will have further updates in upcoming newsletters.

Skills and training update


We've been working closely with Training Services NSW to advocate that water industry training needs are recognised and supported. This has included discussions around the availability of registered training organisations and fee-free training offerings.

The Water Directorate has published some guidance for water utilities who may be considering taking up fee-free training places for <u>Certificate II and III</u>, as well as part <u>qualifications and skillsets</u>, including how to register interest.

As we continue to work through the <u>Water operations skills and training action</u>

plan, we're seeking expressions of interest to form a working group that will inform a key piece of work - a water industry workforce development strategy. If you'd like to be involved reach out at <u>jade.baker@dpie.nsw.gov.au</u>

Advanced Operational Support program



The Advanced Operational Support program is managed by DPE Water. It will adopt a collaborative approach to supporting local water utilities with high-risk treatment plants that are unable to access funding to resolve their risks under the Safe and Secure Water Program.

The program will leverage existing departmental and industry expertise to provide on-the-ground support and funding assistance to optimise the performance of approximately 12 water treatment plants, so that more regional towns have reliable, resilient and safe water services. The program will also provide on-the-ground support for up to 2 sewerage treatment plants.

The program guidelines and expressions of interest to participate will be released in May 2023. Program outcomes will be used to inform future opportunities for the government to support and collaborate with the sector to reduce risks.

Local Government Water Management Conference

The <u>LGNSW Water Management Conference 2023</u> is being held from Monday 26 June to Wednesday 28 June in Parkes. The conference is an opportunity to learn about the latest technical innovations and share best practice in water governance and management.

Key departmental personnel including Deputy Secretary Amanda Jones will represent DPE Water at the conference, and will cover topics on water security, supply to rural communities, dam infrastructure and safety, and the phase 2 delivery of the Town Water Risk Reduction Program.
